W2: Yes. I was taking a break just minutes before the fire started and I was waiting for my colleague to arrive so I could go home. As soon as I heard about the fire, I rushed to the scene. I was able to help a mother and child, so I'm happy about that.

J: Well done. And what about you, Mr Evans? You were the ambulance driver that took some of the people to hospital. What were you doing when you found out about the fire?

M2: I wasn't driving my ambulance when the call came, I was eating a sandwich just outside the hospital. When we first drove to the fire, I was sitting next to the other driver. But then we had to change, so I drove for the rest of the day. No one was seriously injured, so it was a good day for us.

J: That's definitely good news. And you, Mr Jones, are the nurse who took care of all the injured people. What were you doing before it happened?

M3: I was listening to the radio in the nursing station, where we write down the names and other patient details. That's when I heard about the fire, so we immediately prepared the emergency area.

Teaching notes

Award one point per item for accuracy and one point for ability to communicate well.

Activity 9 asks pupils to recycle the vocabulary set from Unit 5 and the future simple from Unit 6.

Ask pupils to look at the jobs and think about how each profession may change in 50 years from now. Allow them to note down some ideas, using the verb prompts to help. Put pupils in pairs and have them take turns to make predictions. Make sure that each pupil has talked about five jobs.

Activity 10 asks pupils to talk about different life experiences and use the present perfect from Unit 7.

Ask pupils to look at the list and think about their own life experiences. Allow them to note down any details. Then have them ask and answer questions in pairs, focusing on the present perfect. More confident pupils could add additional details. Make sure each pupil has asked or answered five questions.
