





## **Teaching notes**

Activities 1 and 2 test ability to identify the activities vocabulary and comprehension of grammar structures *Can you ...? Yes, I can. No, I can't. I can ...* Award one point for each correct answer.

Activity 3 tests identification of activities vocabulary and comprehension of *I can* ... *I can't* ... Award a point for each correct answer.

Activity 4 tests ability to complete grammar structures *Can you ...? Yes, I can. No, I can't.* Award one point for each correctly filled space.

# Speaking

#### **Teaching notes**

Award one point per item for accuracy and one point for ability to communicate well.

Activity 5 asks students to produce activities vocabulary and talk about abilities using *I can ... I can't ...* 

#### I can ... I can't ...

Point to a picture, e.g. a child jumping and say *l can jump*. Point to another picture, e.g. a boy swimming and say *l can't swim*. Point to another picture and encourage a student to answer. Put students in pairs and ask them to take it in turns pointing at the activities and saying what they can or can't do. Each student should point to five activities.

Activity 6 asks students to talk about abilities using *Can you ...?* 

## Number six. Can you hop? Yes, I can.

Read the example dialogue and ask students to repeat. Say a number and ask a question linked to that number, e.g. *Number 12. Can you dance?* Let a student answer. Students work in pairs. Each student says five different numbers and asks and answers questions.

## 5 Point and say.

**Example answers:** I can ride a horse / play football / jump / skip / ride a bike / hop / climb / run / catch a ball / swim / fly a kite / dance. I can't ...

## 6 Say a number. Then ask and answer.

**Example answers:** Can you ride a horse / play football / jump / skip / ride a bike / climb / run / catch a ball / swim / fly a kite / dance? Yes, I can. No, I can't.
